

The 5 moments of hand disinfection

When?	Why?
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Disinfect your hands BEFORE touching the patient	To protect the patient from the transmission of pathogenic germs
Disinfect your hands immediately BEFORE any aseptic task	To protect the patient from pathogenic transmission and prevent the patient's own germs from entering the body
Disinfect your hands immediately AFTER contact with any potentially infectious materials (and after removing gloves)	To protect yourself, your surrounding and other patients from the transmission of pathogenic germs
Disinfect your hands AFTER touching the patient	To protect yourself, your environment and other patients from the transmission of pathogenic germs
Disinfect your hands AFTER contact with objects or furniture in the direct surrounding of the patient – even if you have not touched the patient	To protect yourself, your environment and other patients from the transmission of pathogenic germs
